July 29<sup>th</sup>: Celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Irish immigration We will start our Peterborough trip by meeting at the *Ashburnham Ale House*, 128 Hunter St. East for a relaxing brunch/lunch at 11 am.
